

Advent Reflections: Fourth Sunday of Advent

It all began with a yes. Mary simply said yes to God through the angel Gabriel. And that yes has changed the world forever. Today, on this Christmas Eve, we celebrate both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the Christmas Season. It is appropriate, then, that we think of Mary. Mary, who was holy, devout and sinless, was chosen by God to be the mother of HIS SON JESUS. As the scriptures recount, Mary simply trusted in God's plan of salvation and said yes. 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas


The Fourth Sunday of Advent always falls on the last Sunday before Christmas.

This year, Christmas is on a Monday, which makes the **4**th **Sunday of Advent on Sunday, December 24**th **which is Christmas Eve!**

What that means is that it is an obligation to attend a 4th Sunday of Advent Mass and a Christmas Mass on the same day or very close together.

This gift from the calendar allows us to reflect on the angel Gabriel announcing to Mary that she will bear a son named Emmanuel, which means God With Us. And then either later that same day or the next reflect upon God's coming into the world as a baby, in a manger, in Bethlehem. A manger is a feeding trough, and the word Bethlehem means House of Bread. So, fitting that Jesus, Bread for the World, born in that place, really and truly is present, in the Eucharist. Eucharist is the nourishment we have the opportunity to receive each time we attend Mass. It is the best gift we will ever receive!



What do we mean by consecration?


It is often called a dedication -- it is a deliberate choice to
