

From the Pastor's Desk...

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Parishioners:

Many years ago, I was assigned to a parish along with a priest from India. We got along very well and worked well in ministering to the parish. At the rectory, I noticed that this priest would always remove his shoes before entering his room. One day I asked him why. "Because, for me, this is sacred space. Removing shoes is a sign of humility and respect." I never forgot that simple gesture. In fact, while on pilgrimage in the Holy Land, as tourists are led to visit the temple mount in Jerusalem, and prepare to enter the Muslim mosque, the site of the former Holy of Holies in Jesus's time, everyone is asked to remove their shoes for they are now walking on sacred ground. Sacred space. The presence of God.


Jesus too reminded the people of his time that the temple was sacred space. The place where God's presence dwelt and thus was not meant to be a place of buying and selling. Rather, this was sacred space, a place of prayer and devotion.

As we reflect on all of this in our Lenten journey, we fast forward to today and remember that our parish church, where we worship and pray, where the mass and sacraments are celebrated, where the real presence of Jesus is in the Tabernacle, is also SACRED SPACE.

That is why when we enter, we turn off our cell phones. We refrain from socializing. And we remember to genuflect, bow and bless ourselves when necessary, such as when the priest genuflects or bows during the Nicene Creed. Everyone should do the same. But perhaps the greatest reminder of God's sacred presence is through his Son Jesus, the living temple, that can't be destroyed, but will rise triumphantly from the grave. "My Lord and My


God," the centurion said upon looking at Jesus being crucified. It is the same thing we say when the host is raised during mass, right before communion..."My Lord and My God." Yes, this is sacred ground, let us never forget!

Lenten Regulations

- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
- Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. Therefore, all of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial. All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.
