

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As we quickly approach Easter, we're reminded of the reason why we are celebrating. God's chosen people stumbled quite a bit throughout the Old Testament, so God intervened time, and time, and time again to set them back on the straight and narrow. Whereas we would likely give up on someone over time, God has remained steadfast in his grace, and always will. He created a new covenant with Israel that wrote his law upon the hearts of Jews and Gentiles alike. This new covenant was realized through Jesus Christ, who was born into our flesh and crucified on the cross. He suffered death in perfect obedience to God the Father. By being born into flesh, Jesus united humanity and divinity; through his crucifixion and resurrection, Christ "became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him." He is the law of love that lives within us, and through him "all, from least to greatest, shall know [the Father.]"

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Jesus didn't suffer the cross for his sake or for his own glory. No, our Savior came to preach the kingdom of heaven to us before sacrificing himself for our sins. Notice how in today's Gospel he even admitted he was troubled! It can be terrifying to do God's will for our lives, and Christ himself was troubled by what he was called to do. Yet, in love and trust in the Father, Jesus was obedient, saying "but it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." All Christians are called to a life of self-sacrifice, each to the degree it serves God's purpose. We are all called to give up our lives for the sake of love to glorify God. Without Christ's sacrifice, we would not have been saved; without our willingness to pursue God's call upon our life, the kingdom of God cannot be realized on this earth.

REFLECT The Lord placed his law upon your heart the moment you were conceived, but how do you allow him to shine through your life? How do you serve and glorify the Lord? Take a moment today to reflect on your words and actions and consider how you show the world that God is Lord over your life for all time, not only during Lent.

## From the Pastor's Desk...

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather today to celebrate this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we realize that Holy Week, the time of Jesus' passion, death and Resurrection is fast approaching. We notice the words of Jesus today reminding us of this: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified" (John 12:23). And so Jesus uses images to remind us of this: the grain of wheat dying and rising; Jesus being lifted up from the Earth, drawing everyone to himself. But there are some other interesting images worth mentioning: the presence of the angel and the servant.


I am reminded of the Passion play two years ago that I was fortunate to be able to witness in Germany. As I watched the play, I noticed the presence of the angel that stayed with Jesus throughout the whole of his passion and crucifixion and death. He never abandoned him. The angel gave Jesus the Father's hope, trust and strength during these difficult moments. Perhaps we need to remember that God is also with us, during the most difficult moments of our life. We need to trust in that no matter how tough it gets because it is so easy to give up. "Follow me," says Jesus. Follow me.

That brings us to the servant. Notice what Jesus says: "Whoever serves me must follow me....." Who will be the servants, the priests and deacons to come? Who will take my place at the altar of the Lord? These are good questions to ask. Hopefully parents will talk about vocations to their children. Hopefully men and

women will all listen to the Lord who might be calling them in priesthood, diaconate or religious life.

## **Lenten Regulations**

- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is sinful.
- Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year.
   Therefore, all of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial. All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the chari-table works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.
