## From the Pastor's Desk: Advent Reflections Second Sunday of Advent



"I am not getting out of here alive. Prepare Yourself." It is hard to believe, but these were the very words Carlo Acutis told his own mother as she drove him to the hospital for the last time. After a short life of 15 years, Carlo Acutis, who loved the Lord Jesus deeply, eventually succumbed to Leukemia and died. Beatified in 2020. it was with great joy that the Church celebrated his canonization as a saint in October. Carlo was a great witness of faith to all those who knew him. including his own mother, who came back to her faith and to the Church because of him. And through his devotion to the Eucharist through his website documenting Eucharistic miracles throughout the world, Carlo continues to help us in our faith and prepare us one day to meet the Lord ourselves.

The Scriptures today remind us, however, that it was St. John the Baptist who began the time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. Once again we remember that it was John who cried out to all who would come to him: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." Today, that cry is for us too. Once again, John encourages us to look deep at our lives and way of living and perhaps make changes. Straighten things out. For some this might mean changing some bad habits, or changing words and thoughts we might say or think. In all cases it means getting rid of anything in our life that blocks the way to Christ.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation can help. This year we will offer the sacrament on Sunday, December 14<sup>th</sup> with several priests on hand to help us prepare. If you have been away from confession, perhaps now is a good time to return and "clear the path." For the Lord is coming. And he comes at a moment we do not expect. Prepare and be at your very best!!

The Filipino Simbang Gabi celebration is a hallmark of Filipino culture! All Are Welcome to join us for this beautiful tradition!

This was introduced by the Spanish friars at the start of Catholic Evangelization of the Philippine Islands more than 400 years ago. This is a 9 day celebration of Advent Novena Masses in preparation for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Unique in the celebration is the use of White Vestment, Singing the Gloria and the Simbang Gabi Ritual in the Advent Masses. This tradition is celebrated in many parishes in the Diocese of Joliet from December 14th to 22nd.












# HOW DO WE MAKE DISCIPLES?

#### **Resources for Personal Growth**

- Go to Confession regularly, such as quarterly, monthly, or weekly:
  - Visit MassTimes.org and select "confession" using the drop-down, then search in your area for times. It is always best to verify these times with your parish using their website, bulletin, or by calling.
- Learn about the lives of saints with a resource such as "The Merry Beggars"
- Read books on the saints, such as "Lives of the Saints"
- Read writings of the saints, such as "Story of a Soul" and "An Introduction to the Devout Life"



## **CONFESSION** - Step two

Our conversion moves us to a deeper life of faith in Jesus and a desire to shape our lives according to His Gospel. In Jesus, we have a personal Savior who wants to forgive our sins so that we can live freely as beloved children of God.



St. Augustine of Hippo's Confessions offers a powerful depiction of the human struggle with sin and the healing grace found in repentance. As a young man, Augustine was deeply entangled in sins of unchastity, and although he intellectually accepted

the truth of the Christian faith, his will remained weak. His inner conflict reached a turning point when, in a moment of desperation, he prayed for God's help. It was then that he heard the mysterious voice of a child urging him to "pick it up" and "read it," prompting him to open a nearby copy of St. Paul's letters.

When Augustine opened to Romans 13:13–14, the words struck him with transformative force, calling him away from sin and toward life in Christ. He describes this moment as an infusion of divine certainty that illuminated his heart and dissolved his resistance. After years of wandering from God, Augustine was finally ready to embrace the fullness of grace offered through the Church's sacraments, marking the beginning of his conversion and his lifelong testimony to God's mercy.


